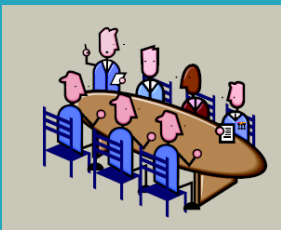

Conferences in Review

Oct 2010 Atlantic Nursing Informatics Conference, Moncton

The theme of this conference was *The Fabric of Change*. And this was evident in the presentation by Peggy White, guest speaker from Canadian Health Outcomes for Better Information and Care (C-HOBIC). She discussed the implementation of a database of standardized nursing assessment terminology – becoming leaders in standardized nursing documentation in Ontario. An update on New Brunswick's One Patient One Record, and the Drug Information System initiatives were presented; along with a retrospective view of Nursing Informatics and where it's heading. Decision Support highlighted benefits of integrated information and qualitative and quantitative benefits and were among the many presenters at the conference. It was all tied together with how to implement a change management model successfully to enhance staff's coping in an ever changing world. It was an excellent conference!

Who is an Informatics Nurse?

Heather graduated from St. F.X. U in 1985 and has been working at the IWK Health Centre since 1985 where she first worked as a pediatric nurse (9 years) and has been with the Clinical Trials Research Center at the Canadian Center for Vaccinology (IWK Goldbloom Pavilion) for 16 years. Heather has been coordinating the work of the 12 nurses monitoring the 12 pediatric centers involved in the IMPACT program (Immunization Monitoring Program Active) since 1998. The program runs more smoothly due to informatics whether it be screening admissions and outpatients by reviewing their electronic health record where it exists, entering data on reportable events and diseases on secure web modules for the program or the fact that communication by email among all team members from coast to coast is the primary means of communication.
