Who is an Informatics Nurse?

I have been working as an RN since 1985. It was in 2003 that I was first introduced to Nursing Informatics when the unit I was working on began using the Order Entry application through Meditech. This was, to say the least, a challenge for me as I had very limited experience with computers up to this point in my life. In 2005, my experience was enhanced with the introduction of PCS (electronic documentation) on my unit. I once again was faced with a challenge, and I was able to move forward and actually became quite interested in this application and very quickly realized that it allowed me the opportunity to document in a much more complete and organized manner.

In October of 2011, I began a new job as Clinical Informatics Trainer for CBDHA. This position relies heavily on Informatics. I am responsible for training Meditech applications such as, Order Entry, PCS, and EMR, along with Medworxx UM (electronic bed utilization tool). I train all disciplines within the district. To do so, I must have a good understanding of how these systems work as well as how they interface with each other. I depend greatly on other systems within our district as well, such as our hospital Intranet for scheduling training sessions, email for communicating with other district employees as well as HITS staff. With our district being so large and travel not always being an option I also use the Bomgar application to do some training sessions.

I know that Informatics is here to stay and is only going to broaden into a much larger part of our work life. I believe that staff members are definitely up for the challenge, since computer use has become much more prevalent in our academic and social lives.
