The Scientific Map is also a useful tool for nurses working in informatics to help explore their sub-specialty interest.

Here are a couple of questions for you to muse over as you view the map:

- Can you find yourself?
- Pick 2-3 fields that interest you and ask yourself "What interests me about this career choice?"
- Are you currently working in one of your choices? How will you prepare yourself for this career choice?
- Is the map all-inclusive? Do you think there is anything that should be added?

As your knowledge in the field of informatics increases your sub-specialty choices may change. Reorienting yourself with the map over time may be helpful to keep you on track with your career interests.
